



TICKETING & OPENING HOURS

What are the dates for the exhibition?

The Art Gallery of New South Wales' Archibald Prize 2020 is on display at Tweed Regional Gallery from Friday 22 January 2021 to Sunday 7 March 2021.

What are the opening hours of the exhibition?

Wednesday to Sunday from 10am to 5pm.

Electronic check-in is required for all Gallery visitors upon entry.

Do you I need to book to visit the Cafe?

Cafe is open Wednesday to Sunday from 9.30am to 4.00pm.

Bookings are required for 5 people or more.

Do I need to buy tickets for a specific time?

Tickets are dated, but not timed. You may visit the exhibition at any time during opening hours on the date purchased, however please be aware that wait times for entry into the exhibition may be experienced during busy periods.

How much do tickets cost?

Adult: \$12

Gallery Friend/Foundation member: \$7

Concession or child 5–17 years: \$8

Family (2 adults + up to 3 children): \$30

Children under 5 years: Free

Bus group booking: \$8 per person

School/education group booking: \$6 per person

Where can I buy tickets?

Can I buy tickets to the exhibition on the day?

Pre-booking tickets online is highly recommended, however tickets are also available for purchase on iPads in the Gallery Foyer. People buying tickets at the door may experience delays.

Who can purchase concession tickets?

Concession pricing is valid for:

- Health Care cardholders
- Pension cardholders
- Veterans Affairs cardholders
- Student cardholders (full-time students aged 18 or over)

Valid ID may be required upon exhibition entry or at the time of ticket purchase.

Are group bookings available?

A booking agreement is essential for all groups over 10 people wishing to visit the Gallery. Bus groups arriving without a booking may not be able to enter the building under our COVID-Safe plan. Are guided tours available?

Due to the large crowds expected at the exhibition, guided tours are not available during opening hours.

Is there an audio guide?

The exhibition is accompanied by a free mobile audio guide. Access on your phone by scanning the QR codes throughout the exhibition and don't forget to bring along your headphones. Free wifi is available in the Gallery.

Will the exhibition be accompanied by any public programs?

Are school group bookings available?

Educators are encouraged to pre-plan their visit using the education resources which will be available to download online closer to the exhibition dates.

How long does it take to see the exhibition?

The estimated time to view the exhibition is 30–45 minutes.

Can I enter and exit the exhibition more than once with my ticket?

No, each ticket is valid for a single entry. If you exit the exhibition, you will be required to purchase another ticket to re-enter.

Do I need a ticket for the rest of the Gallery?

No, the rest of the Gallery remains free of charge.

Can I exchange my tickets for another date if I cannot make the original booking date?

You can manage your own booking via the ticket confirmation email from Eventbrite. However, if your day has lapsed, tickets cannot be refunded or exchanged.

Who is Eventbrite and why do I need to provide personal details online?

Online ticket sales for the Archibald Prize 2020 are hosted by Eventbrite, an Australian ticketing management system. Some basic personal information is required when purchasing tickets to ensure Tweed Regional Gallery can manage your booking and any follow up required.

ABOUT THE EXHIBITION

Who developed the exhibition? Archibald Prize 2020 is an Art Gallery of New South Wales touring exhibition supported by presenting partner ANZ.

Are the Wynne and Sulman prizes showing at Tweed Regional Gallery as well?
No, Tweed Regional Gallery is only showing artworks from the Art Gallery of New South Wales' Archibald Prize 2020.

How many artworks are in the exhibition?
The Archibald Prize 2020 tour includes works from 54 of the 55 finalists.

Unfortunately, Marcus Wills' portrait *Requiem (JR)* will not travel as part of the Archibald Prize 2020 regional tour. This decision has been made due to logistical complexities, to mitigate risk and to protect the artwork.

ANZ PEOPLE'S CHOICE AWARD

Is there an ANZ People's Choice Award?
Yes, the ANZ People's Choice Award is awarded at each exhibiting venue.

Where can I vote for the ANZ People's Choice Award?
You may vote once for the ANZ People's Choice Award at Tweed Regional Gallery using the QR code located in the final room of the exhibition. Entries close 21 February 2021.

Is there a prize for the People's Choice?
The People's Choice award carries a \$3500 cash prize for the winning artist for the Sydney exhibition. However, for the regional tour, there is no associated prize for the artist.

One person who voted for the Tweed Regional Gallery's People's Choice award-winning painting will be selected at random to win the People's Choice voters' prize.

Can I see this exhibition elsewhere in Australia?
Tweed Regional Gallery is the first venue to host the 2020 Archibald Prize regional tour.

The exhibition will then tour to the following venues:

- Cairns Art Gallery, 19 March 2021 – 2 May 2021
- Griffith Regional Art Gallery, 14 May 2021 – 27 June 2021
- Broken Hill Regional Art Gallery, 9 July 2021 – 22 August 2021
- Shoalhaven Regional Gallery, 3 September 2021 – 17 October 2021
- Penrith Regional Gallery, Home of the Lewers Bequest, 29 October 2021 – 9 January 2022
