In terms of flora, fauna and landscapes, the region known as *Australia's Green Cauldron* is one of the most diverse in Australia. The Caldera Art exhibition presents work by some of the many artists who are passionate about the need to preserve the rich biodiversity and ecosystems which are under constant threat from human impact.

Due to its unique natural history and cultural resonance, the remnant Tweed Shield Volcano region is now one of only a handful of places in Australia to be selected as an iconic 'National Landscape'. Caldera Art seeks to generate a positive emotional response to this natural environment and encourage the viewer to take an interest in what living things are to be found under the surface, in the canopy, on the ground, in the sky, and in their own backyard.
